## Weaving-On Loom, Beginning

Wk. 1: Intro to calculating yardage and warping for a sampler; explanation of different kinds of looms and fibers in the studio.

- Wk. 2: Dressing the loom; intro to drafting.
- Wk. 3: Starting to weave; learn to roll bobbins and throw a shuttle.
- Wks 4-9: Continuing to weave the sampler for those who have finished the Sampler, a new project is chosen and completed.
- Wk. 10: Finishing of the fabric is discussed, such as washing(fulling the fabric), Edges, joins, hems, and embellishments.

Materials fee: \$4.00 for sampler.

## Weaving-On Loom, Continuing

Wk. 1: Choosing/designing a project and assigning looms.

Wk. 2-10: Dressing the loom, weaving and finishing the project. Materials are available in the studio, but are usually purchased by the student from the appropriate yarn source elsewhere.
